Healthy cooking and food-buying practices: Community intervention to increase fruit and vegetable consumption among low-income households

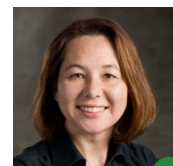

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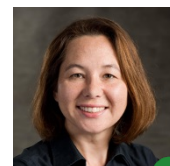
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
